## Sale pick-up May 18 and 19

**Numbers of trees are very limited.** Please supply a first and second choice if desired. Your check will be returned if your choices are not available. Trees are first come first served.

Prior to the pick-up dates, you will receive a mailed reminder with details about your order. Please bring that paperwork to the pick-up event, or give it to your designated representative (if someone else is picking up the trees for you) to ensure a smooth pick-up process. Trees that are not collected on the designated dates will be planted in Shorewood parks. No refunds will be given.

Submit payment in the form of a check payable to City of Shorewood and mail to City of Shorewood Tree Sale, 5755 Country Club Road, Shorewood, MN 55331. Orders may be mailed or delivered in person to city hall. **A 24-hour drop box is located at city hall for your convenience.**

### Ordering Trees

- A very limited number of trees have been ordered and are offered on a first-come, first-serve basis. The intent of the sale is to diversify Shorewood's tree stock in an effort to reduce the effects of tree diseases such as Emerald Ash Borer and Dutch Elm Disease. Orders will be processed for single family homeowners. Townhouse and association properties should contact the city for order. Unlike a retail nursery, these trees do not have a warranty.

# Shorewood's 2018 Tree Sale

In an effort to diversify the tree stock in the city, Shorewood has combined forces with the City of Minnetonka tree sale. Shorewood is a city with many ash trees, and the threat of the Emerald Ash Borer is eminent. The tree sale offers the opportunity to get a large, balled tree at whole-sale prices. By planting trees now, the city will have established other trees before the ash borer arrives! **Please do not plant any trees in right-of-way or under power lines.**

All trees are selected for the west metro area by an arborist. To view photos of the tree species, see the link on the city web site, [www.ci.shorewood.mn.us](http://www.ci.shorewood.mn.us). All trees are supplied on a first-come, first-serve basis. The earlier your order is received, the better your chance of getting your top selections. **Note the pick-up location is at Minnetonka Public Works.**

Trees **MUST** be picked up on designated dates or you **forfeit the tree and the money you paid for it.** Leftover trees will be planted in Shorewood parks.

Species	Cost	Sun or Shade?	Significant features	Mature Height	Mature Spread	Con-tainer
Pagoda Dogwood	\$45	full sun to shade	This woodland tree is a great replacement for buckthorn. It gets cream-colored flowers and dark blue fruit. In fall it turns red. Attracts butterflies and songbirds.	15-20 ft.	20-25 ft.	#7
Blue Beech	\$75	full sun to shade	Blue beech is a small slow-growing tree. As a landscape plant, it is one of the few trees that thrives in full shade. It is also adaptable to a wide range of soil textures, moisture levels, drainage patterns, and pH levels. In the landscape it is used as a small shade tree, an accent of specimen plant, and in naturalized and woodland settings. It is not a preferred food source for deer.	20-35 ft	20-35 ft	#10
Purple Prince Crab-Red	\$55	full sun	Beautiful rose-red flowers and maroon fruit make this a favorite of songbirds and pollinators. It turns a bronze-gold color in the fall.	18 ft	18 ft	#7
Cathedral Elm	\$55	full sun	A hybrid of Japanese and Siberian elms, bred to have increased resistance to Dutch elm disease. Tolerant of cold winter temperatures. The fast-growing 'Cathedral' elm has a rounded canopy with dark green foliage that turns yellow in autumn. Plant in well-drained soil if possible, but the 'Cathedral' elm will grow in most soil types. It requires full sunlight to thrive. Commit to pruning regularly in the first 15 years to maintain one main leader and good branching structure. Pruning during the growing season is not recommended.	40-50 ft	40-50 ft	#10
American Larch (Tamarack)	\$75	full sun	Minnesota's only deciduous conifer, which means it loses its needles in the fall. Each spring, a new set of lush, bright green needles emerge. This tree has a pyramidal shape and drooping branches. Tamarack tolerate a variety of soils if mulched with wood chips and watered regularly during periods of drought. This is a great tree to plant in groups along a wetland.	40-80 ft	15-30 ft	#10
White Pine SOLD OUT	\$75	full sun to part shade	Fastest growth rate of all the state's pine species. Unlike other pines, which have rigid needles, white pine needles are long, bright green and "soft." This tree will not thrive if planted in a wet, heavy clay soil—it is best planted in a well-drained soil. Additionally, the needles may become yellow if soil pH is too high (alkaline); this condition can be treated if you are aware of the issue.	25 ft	30 ft	#10
Balsam Fir SOLD OUT	\$75	full sun to full shade	One of the few pines that will thrive in full shade. Does well in damp places. Needles are flat and fragrant. Does not like heavy clay soil, but does not mind peat.	50-75 ft	20-35 ft	#10
